Dear 4-H Animal Project Members and Parents:

Your attention to this letter and the enclosed documents is very important. The **online** Fair Entry process (and in some cases the paper-based Fair Entry process) must be completed by June 27th. 4-H members who do not meet this deadline will not be guaranteed space at the Porter County Fair. *(Please note that the typical due date is June 25th, but is extended this year due to the date falling on a weekend.)*

Read Your Handbook:

Please be sure to review the Handbook, paying close attention to your project pages and the opening sections. ***It is the responsibility of the 4-H member and his/her family to obtain, read, and understand their 4-H resources.*** The handbook is available on the county 4-H website. (<https://bit.ly/2022PorterCo4HHandbook>)

Online FairEntry & Why It's Required:

The online FairEntry system will remain open until June 27th. You must register all animals you plan to exhibit at the fair by June 27th. **Siblings must designate who will be exhibiting which animal at this time – and decisions during the FairEntry process are final.** ***Missing the June 27th deadline may result in NOT EXHIBITING at the county fair!***

This is a **required process** that aids our staff and volunteers in making your fair experience as smooth as possible. By entering your animals into FairEntry, it prepares our Livestock Show Data Team to be able to check your animals in at the fair as efficiently as possible and allows our Celebration Sale Committee to get started with preparing for the sale.

If after entering your animals, you feel you have made a mistake, please contact Angel at the Extension Office (465-3555, amleuck@purdue.edu) or our volunteer Show Data Coordinator Amber Cable (476-6583, awilson794@gmail.com) to check for you. The sooner we correct it, the less the chance of confusion when you arrive at the fair.

Fair Entry Forms (formerly known as stall forms) – Not a substitute for online FairEntry:

Enclosed you may find paper Fair Entry form(s) for animal projects. ***DO NOT CONSIDER THE PAPER FORM TO BE A SUBSTITUTE TO THE ONLINE PROCESS!*** These forms are being distributed at the request of the project superintendents. Official entry should be completed via online FairEntry. ***If your animals are not entered in the online system, you will not appear in the computer system used by our committees to manage the shows and the Celebration Sale!*** Therefore, it is of utmost importance that you ***DO NOT CONSIDER THE PAPER FORM TO BE A SUBSTITUTE TO THE ONLINE PROCESS!*** These forms are being distributed at the request of the project superintendents, and they ask that you turn the form in by June 27th.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA):

To exhibit beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, goats, poultry, and/or rabbits, 4-H members ***MUST BE CERTIFIED*** through the educational YQCA program. If you did not attend an in-person class, you'll need to complete the course online. Get all the details at <https://bit.ly/2022PorterCoYQCA>. ***Please complete your YQCA requirement by June 27th.***

REPORTING YOUR COMPLETION:

- If you complete an in-person YQCA session held in Porter County, be sure you went to <https://yqcaprogram.org> and registered your participation with the coupon code you received at the session. .
- If you completed online or elsewhere, please complete the form and upload a pic of your certification at <https://bit.ly/ReportYourYQCA> to let us know you are certified. (The new YQCA system does not sync with 4HOnline. You can access your certification by logging in to <https://yqcaprogram.org/>. If you need help with the YQCA online platform, please contact help@yqcaprogram.org.)

Animal Health Information:

If while checking your animal in, the project committee sees possible signs of disease on your animal(s), ***you will be asked to return your animal to your trailer and wait until a veterinarian arrives*** to assess the situation. Animals may be sent home if they are found to have clinical signs of disease. Animal health is a serious topic and your full cooperation and understanding is expected on health-related matters.

Building and Barn Set-up/Clean-up Day – Many Hands Make Light Work!

Saturday July 9th at 8:00 a.m. (until done) will be fairgrounds clean-up and set-up day. Barns and the 4-H Exhibit Building will be cleaned up, set-up, and otherwise prepared for the fair. Contact your animal project superintendent for details.

Fair Pass Pick-Up:

You can pick up your fair passes (and exhibit tags for 4-H Building projects) on July 14th or 15th at the 4-H Building Office from 8:30-4:30. Additional 4-H Building Office hours will be included in the 2022 fair schedule that will soon be available the county 4-H Hub at <https://portercounty4h.org/>.

General Information:

- It is an expectation that you be at the fair on a daily basis. Not only should **YOU** be providing daily care to your 4-H animal exhibit, but you should also be aware of when show orders and sale orders are posted and check them immediately and report any discrepancies to the Livestock Office. Do not wait until show time or the sale is underway to report a necessary edit to the information.
- Familiarize yourself with the Livestock Terms & Conditions in the 4-H Handbook. One item of note is that if you need a substitute showman to assist you with showing your animals, it must be a current Porter Co. 4-H member. This does not include Mini 4-H members, as Mini 4-H is a non-competitive program and Mini 4-Hers are not to be involved in competitive classes.
- **4-H member help is needed** with Celebration Sale set-up and tear-down at the Show Arena. Check with the livestock office for exact set-up times.
- State information is available at <https://www.indianastatefair.com/p/state-fair/competitions-contests/livestock-information>
- The Indiana **State Fair 4-H Animal Affidavit** form is required for all livestock shown at the Indiana State Fair. These are to be taken with you when the 4-H Exhibitor enters his/her animal at the State Fair. Download the affidavit at the above-listed website.
- Members of Beef, Dairy, Sheep, and Swine exhibiting at State Fair must stop by the 4-H Building Office (at the fairgrounds) **by 3:00 p.m. on the last Friday of fair** and report which animals went through the sale. Bring tag/notch numbers with you so that we can cross-reference them with your 4-H Online record and the Celebration Sale information.
- Members of Sheep & Goat projects: If your animals have not yet been tagged with the USDA Scrapie tag, it is **your responsibility** to tag them prior to the Porter County Fair. For animals that have been tagged with the Scrapie tag, **do not remove** the tag for any reason. Any questions you may have about the Scrapie program should be directed to the Board of Animal Health at 317-544-2400.
